BREAKFAST CLUBS: EARLY BIRWILLUE

Our FREE Early Bird Club is open for all children daily from 8:15am. Cereal, toast and juice will be served daily in the foundation stage corridor for P1 and P2 children and also in the KS1 corridor for children in P3-P7. As well as breakfast club other clubs are available in the morning including Mathletics in the ICT suite, Reading Rockets in Mrs O' Connors room, Board Games in the learning support room and Connect 4 tournament in Mrs O'Connor's room. PARENT CONSULTATIONS

Parent Consultations will take place on the week beginning Monday 14th November Parents will be invited to come into school to meet with the teacher. The purpose of the meeting is to discuss schoolwork and anything else that may affect the happiness and wellbeing of your child at school. Each meeting is scheduled for 15 minutes and your allocated time and day will be sent out soon. We intend to keep to the times allocated but do understand that additional time may be required. As always, a meeting may be arranged at any stage of the year if you wish to speak to the teacher about your child. Please note no afterschool's clubs will operate during this week. Breakfast Club and siblings club will continue as usual.

ATTENDANCE MATTERS

As you are already aware it is essential that your child attends school regularly and maintain a pattern of good attendance throughout their school career. Excellent attendance at school is important to allow children to fulfill their potential. Every single day a child is absent from school equates to a day of lost learning. In school we have an obligation to monitor children's attendance very closely and to report attendance percentages to the Education Welfare Officer on a regular basis. Punctuality is essential as each time a child is late to school they are marked late and when they arrive after registration has closed (09:15)- this impacts on their attendance. If your child's attendance is causing concern, we will follow the agreed procedures in school:

- The class teacher will inform you if your child's attendance percentage (below 85%)
- If attendance continues to cause concern, then you will receive a letter from school
- If attendance continues to cause concern, then you will be invited to a pre-referral meeting in school. Our EWO Mrs Marcella Doherty may be in attendance
- If your child's attendance is 85% or below/causing concern, we are obliged to make a referral to EWS.

If you need to discuss any issues surrounding absences or support strategies that can be put in place to improve attendance, during the school year, please contact Mrs Concannon.

Please ensure that you contact the school office in the morning if your child is not able to attend school.



EARLY WITHDRAWAL

Early withdrawal causes disruption to valuable teaching time. It is essential that non medial appointments take place after 3:00pm. Please note that early withdrawal from school is marked as absence and are closely monitored by the Educational Welfare Officer.
